Mission: develop, protect, and enhance the Central Oregon mountain bike experience through trail stewardship, advocacy, collaboration, and education

COTA started a Crook County Chapter in 2013

Since that time the Crook County Chapter has:

- Raised over \$200,000 in grants for mountain bike trails and projects in Crook County
- Averaged over 500 volunteer hours per year since 2014 providing a value of over \$99,000 to Crook County [3,500 hours at a rate of \$28.54 (ref: Independent Sector)]
- Constructed the 10 mile 66 neighborhood trail network in partnership with OR State Parks, CCPRD, and Crook County
- Constructed the Prineville Community Bike Park in partnership with CCPRD and the City of Prineville
- Rehabilitated 3 historic trails (19 miles) in Ochoco National Forest

There are Currently 27 Crook County COTA members; over 2000 COTA members overall

Six COTA Chapters: Crook County, Madras, Redmond, Sisters, South Deschutes County and Bend

COTA's annual revenue has exceeded \$200,000 annually for 2019 and 2020 and is on track to exceed \$300,000 in 2021

COTA has already received a \$50,000 pledge toward the Lemon Gulch project

The City of Prineville is now looking to partner with COTA volunteers for the construction of neighborhood trails in the Barnes Butte Recreation Area

- COTA volunteer labor will offer a savings of \$15 - \$25,000 per mile of trail constructed [estimated cost of hiring a professional contractor to build these trails]
